

CHILD RIGHTS POLICY

As the Catamaran Quality Times Resort Hotel Family, we are committed to treating all our guests — including children — with the awareness and responsibility that comes from being a long-established institution in tourism. We aim to provide service by fully adhering to national and international values, human rights, and the principles of child rights. We adopt the following principles:

- To respect every child's right to freedom of thought, conscience, and religion,
- To recognize that every child has the right to a standard of living adequate for their physical, mental, spiritual, moral, and social development.
- To acknowledge that every child has the right to education.
- To embrace the understanding that no child who belongs to an ethnic, religious, or linguistic minority — whether they are our guests or not — can be denied the right to enjoy their own culture, to profess and practice their own religion, and to use their own language, together with other members of their community.
- To guarantee the protection of children from all forms of sexual exploitation and abuse. In this regard, we commit to taking all necessary national, bilateral, and multilateral measures to prevent: the inducement or coercion of a child to engage in any unlawful sexual activity; the exploitative use of children in prostitution or other unlawful sexual practices; the exploitative use of children in pornographic performances and materials.

We adopt it as a principle:

We recognize the child's right to rest, leisure, play, recreational activities appropriate to their age, and to participate freely in cultural and artistic life. We promote and respect the child's full participation in cultural and artistic life, and encourage the provision of equal and appropriate opportunities for children to engage in activities related to rest, leisure, art, and culture.

The protection of children and their rights is embedded in our institutional culture. This policy is conveyed to all staff during initial orientation and regular training sessions, with a clear directive that in cases of suspected or observed child abuse, it must be reported immediately to hotel management and the relevant District Gendarmerie authorities.
